Kindle Cover

- 1. Cut two pieces of fabric and one piece of low-loft batting, all measuring $7'' \times 20''$.
- 2. Layer as a quilt and quilt as desired.
- 3. Trim to 6 ½" x 19".
- 4. Bind one short end with $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " binding on the right side. Turn to the back and hand sew or pin in place and stitch in the ditch from the front.
- 5. Center the hook side of a 1" piece of Velcro 1 ½" below the top edge of the binding and sew around its edges to attach.
- 6. If you plan to embellish the back of the pouch, do so now. (The center of your embellishment should be about 8" from the unfinished top edge of the rectangle.)
- 7. Fold up 7" on the bound end, right sides of the pouch together, and pin on both sides. Baste sides from the bound edge down.
- 8. Round the corners of the unfinished short end. (I trace around a large spool and trim off the corners on the traced lines.)
- 9. Cut a 1 ½" strip of bias binding. Starting on the back side of the pouch, fold under the end of the bias binding and start sewing binding to edge of pouch with a ¼" seam. Continue around curves on top edge and down the other side. Before reaching the end of the second side, cut off excess binding, leaving an extra ¼" to fold under at the corner before finishing sewing.
- 10. Turn under raw edge of binding and hand sew as invisibly as possible.
- 11. On the wrong side of the top flap, center the loop side of the 1" piece of Velcro against the edge of binding. Sew by machine.
- 12. Fold over flap and join Velcro.
